<u>Mobility</u>

- 2 Good No trouble getting around, enjoys physical activities like walking / running / playing
- 1 Decreased Has difficulty getting around and/or needs assistance, tires easily, requires pain management
- **0 Poor** Not able to get up/down without assistance, pain medication no longer helping

Nutrition & Hydration

- 2 Good Normal eating & drinking habits, maintaining a steady healthy weight & body condition
- 1 **Decreased –** Decreased appetite, needs hand fed, marked change in water intake (increase OR decrease)
- **0 Poor** No appetite, requires regular subcutaneous fluids, noticeable change in weight / body condition

Elimination

- **2** Good Regular urination, formed stools, no vomiting
- 1 Decreased Abnormal stools and/or urination, accidents in house or outside litterbox, frequent vomiting
- 0 Poor Unable to control bowel and/or bladder function

<u>Hygiene</u>

- 2 Good Heathy skin / hair that is clean, regular personal grooming
- Decreased Unkempt appearance, dull haircoat, matted hair, requires assistance to stay clean after stool / urine elimination
- **0 Poor** Urinates and/or defecates on themselves, has pressure sores

<u>Attitude</u>

- 2 Good Happy and playful, interacts with family and other household pets
- 1 **Decreased –** Acts depressed and/or lethargic, decreased interaction with others
- **0 Poor** Minimal interactions, hiding in / under things, easily gets confused or "lost"

Favorite Things

- **2** Good Readily enjoys favorite toys, activities, treats, bed, etc.
- 1 **Decreased –** Needs encouragement to participate in their favorite activities
- **0 Poor** Shows no desire or interest in their favorite things

Quality of Life Scale

- **12 9** Good quality of life your pet is doing well, no further action needed
- 6 8 Decreased quality of life your pet is not well and may require medical intervention
- **0 5** Poor quality of life your pet is suffering, and humane euthanasia should be considered
